Minutes of a meeting held in the Village Hall on  
Wednesday June 1<sup>ST</sup> at 8:00 p.m.

It was resolved that on submission of a satisfactory written estimate for the work of re-glazing the large windows in the Hall, that Mr. J. Bleay be asked to carry out the necessary work.

The Treasurer was authorised to withdraw sufficient funds from the reserves to pay for this work.

The Secretary presented his resignation the Committee decided to nominate Mr Roy Jones to replace him

It was resolved that Mr. Pollard be paid his usual honorarium of £20 for the past year  
It was also resolved that Mrs Burton's salary be increased to £18 per month.
