Minutes of a meeting held in the Village Hall on

The Secretary reported on a letter of complaint about

After some discussion it was resolved that Mr. Hornington  
be given one months notice of dismissal, provided that  
a replacement could be found. Such a replacement  
to be appointed initially for a 3 months probation

period.

It was resolved that on submission of a satisfactory written estimate for the work of re-glazing the large windows in the Hall, that Mr. J. Bley be asked to carry out the necessary work.

The Treasurer was authorised to withdraw sufficient funds from the reserves to pay for this work.

The Secretary presented his resignation the Committee decided to nominate Mr Roy Jones to replace him

It was resolved that Mr. Pollard be paid his usual honorarium of £20 for the past year

It was also resolved that Mrs Burton's salary be increased to £18 per month.

REPORT.

Mr Rumbold stated that the balance at the end of the month was £317-0-0.

OUTSIDE

WORKS.

These were to be done in two parts. (1) Painting the outside of the church. (2) The completion of the surround excluding the car park. For this work a sum of £220-0-0 had been quoted.

Mr Rumbold stated that the Parish Council had been approached

concerning a grant or loan towards the cost of the work.

VILLAGE

HALL DANCES

Mr Jones said that complaints had been made about the motor cycles stopping and starting outside the Hall on dance evenings. The committee decided to ask Mr Parker not to admit dancers to the Hall after 9:30 p.m. if a rule concerning this was not in force already. If it could be established that there was time after which no person would be admitted, the police could be informed and their work made easier.

NURSERY

GROUP.

Mr Jones reported that he had written several letters to the County Education Department about the group's grant. The last letter had contained a set of conditions to which the committee was asked to agree. The conditions were read to the committee and the committee agreed to them. Mr Jones was asked



to inform the Education Department of this.

A.O.B. Mr Haynes proposed and Mrs Constable seconded that a sum not exceeding £3-0-0 be spent on decorations for the Hall Christmas.

Miss Vera Legge had asked about a piano for use during her dancing lessons. Mrs J Turner had offered one to the committee and Mr Howard was asked to inspect it.
