

Minutes of the C.G.M. held in Martine Hall on  
10th December 1984

The meeting was unusually well attended. Between 30/40 people attended.

Before the meeting started Mr. Gannon, the Vice Chairman said he wished to comment on the lease as it had been mentioned his name was on it as a signatory. This was not so and in fact he had not seen the lease until a few days ago.

There was a certain amount of confusion and disagreement about the term and condition of this lease before the proper procedure was adopted.

Apologies for absence were received from the Marston Saints Football Club and the Scouts.

Minutes of the last annual general meeting were read and adopted.

Matters arising from the minutes

The question of the labour parties application for a Representative on the Committee being refused Mr. Cox said this was wrong and the Committee had no right to do this. It was pointed out

again that this is a charity and non-political.

The Chairman said 110 years ago he was handed a small notebook by the Son of the Chairman with the request to take over my dad's bad an accident. No one knew where any other papers were and he had carried on from there. With the help of the ladies on the Committee they had run the Bingo which brought in money to help keep the Hall going.

Complaints were made about bedding, damp decoration, toilets, cupboard space, notice board etc.

Chairman said for financial reasons it had not been possible to do everything.

#### Leasurers Report.

Balance in Bank now £670. 8 years ago the roof had been attended to, and as 10 years was the length of time before it needed rectoring, this meant in 2 years a great deal of money would have to be found and he had been trying to build up a balance for this. Originally children got on the roof and when it got very wet the water went through.

Bingo had in the past brought in £15-£16 a week.

but this was finishing on December 18th.

Fire officials had inspected the premises and there were no complaints since the fire door had been put in.

Booking fees were £30 for Saturday, £2.50 an hour, except for Saturday; and Friday £20.

Question raised about things stored in the Committee Room. It was explained they belonged to the Maeston Players and as they no longer wanted them they had given them to Oxford Boys School & Cherwell School. We were waiting for them to collect.

#### Election of Officers

There was a lot of confusion and discussion about this matter.

In the lease 9 organisations were listed for representatives to serve on the Committee plus 6 others. Maeston Parish Council, Maeston Parochial Church Council, Maeston Women's Institute, Maeston & District Allotment Association, Maeston Youth Club, Maeston Players (Drama group) British Legion (Maeston Branch) Maeston Women's Association, & St. Michael's Society of Change Ringers were the official 9 listed.

The Vice Chairman pointed out that under Clause 4 of the lease application for representation on the Committee by existing or newly formed organisations could be made, subject to rules laid down if this is agreed it cannot be effective until approved by the Minister of Education.

It was suggested by some people present this could be ignored but it was also pointed out by others this is a charity and comes under the Charity Commissioners Broad Church Council - Mrs. John Cooper
